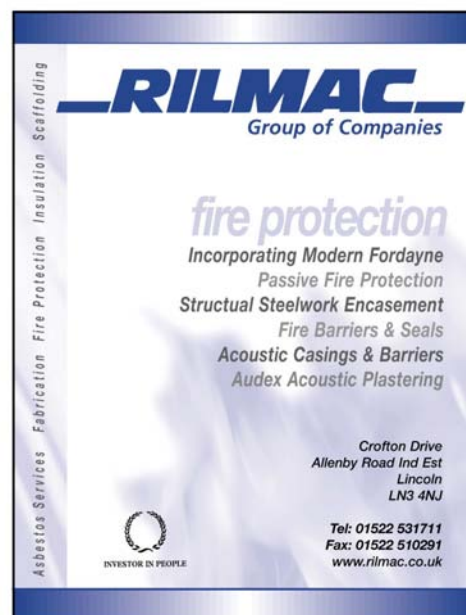

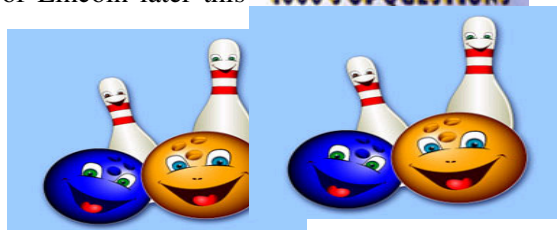
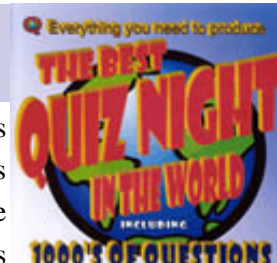

## Linda's Recipe By Linda Hamilton

### CHOCOLATE RAISIN & HAZELNUT TORTE

#### Base

4oz Oat biscuits (hobnobs)  
1.5 oz Butter  
2oz Toasted Hazelnuts (chopped)

#### Method

Reduce biscuits to breadcrumb size in food mixer add hazelnuts and melted butter and spread in the bottom of 7" springform cake tin with 3" sides, or 8" (bottom lined with parchment paper). Bake in preheated oven 200c for 20 minutes. Leave to cool.  
Turn oven down to 150c.

#### Filling

250g Mascapone cheese  
200g Fromage Frais  
3.5oz Dark chocolate  
2 size 1 Eggs  
1.5oz Caster sugar  
2oz Toasted Hazelnuts  
4oz Raisins

#### Method

Melt chocolate over a pan of hot water.  
Whisk mascapone and fromage frais add eggs and sugar whisk again. Fold in melted chocolate. Add raisins and hazelnuts. Pour

over cooled base and cook for 1.25 hours.

Leave in the oven until cool.

Decorate with chocolate curls whipped cream and chocolate-coated raisins.

Yummy. Enjoy.

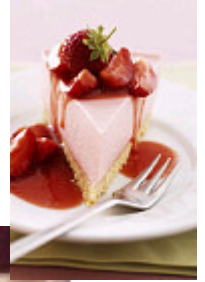
